- 3. Do you remember the first time you realized God had no beginning?
  - a. What effect did that realization have on your worship?
- 4. Does this passage imply that God made the world because He needed something He did not have?
- a. Why is it important that God made the world out of His own will and not because He needed something?
- 5. Where does the definition of good come from according to verse 4?
  - a. If God did not make the world, how would we know what is good?
- 6. Why do you think God made light first (V. 3-4) and then distinguished it from the darkness right away?
- a. What does the presence of light in our world tell us about the character of God?
- 7. Pray for our church to trust God's purpose for creation and the created order. Come to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday from 6:00-6:30 pm in the Worship Center lobby.
