I. Noah's Walk with God (V. 9-10)

- A. A righteous life must be separate from man.
- B. A righteous life must be close to God.

II. The World's Separation from God (V. 11-17)

- A. When people don't walk with God, they walk toward destruction.
- B. When people walk toward destruction, they provoke God to anger.

III. God's Promise to Noah (V. 18-22)

- A. Walking with God means living in complete safety.
- B. Walking in sin means living in great danger.

Discussion Questions

1. Read Genesis 6:9-22
2. How do we know what a righteous person is, according to verses 9-10?
3. What do you think of when you think of the word “corruption?”
 - a. What does the word “corruption” say about mankind’s tendency to destroy itself from the inside out?
4. What was God’s response to mankind’s corruption, according to verse 13?
 - a. Why is God justified to respond this way?
5. What does Noah have to believe about God in order to obey His command to build the ark?
6. What does this passage say about the danger of sin and the safety of righteousness?
 - a. How can you be more aware of the danger of sin in your life?
 - b. How can you be more aware of the safety of living at peace with God?
